Women for long have been victims of oppression, domination and deprived of opportunities in various areas. At present, women have come a long way in the field of education, employment etc., but there still remains inequity as seen in their representation at various levels of decision making arenas and the area of Higher Education is no exception to this. Despite interventions by the State in Higher Education, women are still under-represented in academic leadership positions. Women as active policy makers can bring in their perspectives in framing women friendly policies to complement the efforts of men in bringing gender equality and inclusiveness. Currently, we have enough qualified women to take up to leadership positions in Higher education, as Vice-chancellors, Registrars, and Chairpersons of higher education government bodies, but they have to be motivated and trained to take up these positions. Realizing the gap between the rhetoric and reality in implementing the inclusive policy of the State for women, conscious efforts and interventions are required to enhance the capabilities of women especially for women SC/ST academicians in Higher Education.

In this backdrop, the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) has embarked upon a six-day **Workshop on Women Connect for Leadership and Change** with an objective to build a cadre of women academicians by sensitising them about the prospects and challenges in Higher Education as administrators for positive change and provide them the motivation to gain the skills, self-confidence, access to and take the reins of leadership positions. The trained women can positively impact the lives of young people under their care and revolutionise the education system by bringing about inclusiveness which evade them in spite of reservations.

The workshop revisits the crucial role of women in ascertaining women's access to justice and their rights and the topics include leadership strategies, governance, research, mentoring, inclusiveness, work- life balance, legal awareness, and time & stress management. The Women's Studies perspectives and caste dimensions are built into the topics.
